# Transitioning Back to School

New Student Orientation, August 20<sup>th</sup> @ 1:00 pm: For new incoming students entering Grades K-5 and returning HOA. Students and families will have the opportunity to learn about Central, tour the school, and meet other new students. A separate invitation was sent via email explaining families can visit at 1:00 and listen to Dr. Kern's general overview of Central and then tour or visit at 1:30 for a self-guided tour.

**Kindergarten Orientation, August 26**<sup>th</sup>: Held on the first day of school. Parents and their child should plan to attend the timeframe your child is assigned to attend kindergarten.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to achieve a successful school year.

Let's Get Acquainted (LGA): Please note the date of your child's grade-level information night on page one. I encourage you to attend because the homeroom teachers will provide a brief overview of the curriculum and their expectations. We will also have some key support personnel available so that you can become familiar with the services in place to support student success in the classroom.

First Day of School, August 26th: We spend the first several days of school assisting children to become acclimated to the location of their new classroom and other important spaces in the building. We review bus room procedures and what to do when arriving and leaving the building. Faculty and staff are stationed at doors and hallways to escort our students to their designated bus room until they become comfortable. Students sit by homerooms, then teachers escort their classes to their rooms. Bus/Van riders will enter in the front of the school and students who are car riders will enter on the left side of the building. It is helpful if students know their assigned homeroom teachers name. Don't worry if they forget, we have rosters to help us organize everyone.

**Grade 1:** Homeroom teachers of all grade one students will review and explain all lunch procedures before lunch on the first day of school. We will have several staff on hand during lunch to ensure a smooth transition and make sure all students become comfortable with the procedures. Again, if they forget their number we will have our lists with us.

Lunch Time... We have officially increased student lunch times by 5-minutes. As always, students are permitted to stay in the lunch room beyond the scheduled time if they need more time to eat. Menus are posted monthly on our website.

# New ELA Program for Grades K-5: Wonders

Last spring, the District approved a new English Language Arts program, *Wonders* 2020, as its elementary curriculum resource. *Wonders*, a McGraw Hill product, is designed to help students meet high academic standards and prepare them for future success. Wonders is designed to help students:

- Master foundational skills of phonics, vocabulary, spelling, and word study
- Engage in close reading of complex text and finding evidence
- Become proficient in academic writing
- Take part in daily academic conversations with peers

With *Wonders*, your student will be close reading, writing analytically, and practicing foundational skills using *Wonders* books and support materials in class. Students will also read and reread short, complex texts in the Reading/Writing Companion. They will learn to take notes, ask and answer text-dependent questions, and cite text evidence. Then, students will apply what they have learned as they read and reread the longer Anchor Texts and Leveled Readers.

Additionally, you and your student will be able to access *Wonders* digital content online from home. Each student will receive an online account that will give you access to

- Homework assignments
- Digital copies of all Wonders resources
- Games and other classroom activities

We will continue to communicate additional information for *Wonders* through your student's classroom teacher. We are excited about this transition and look forward to welcoming you back!

### Technology...

All students K-5 will receive a District issued device during the first few week of school. Look for an email from the District regarding insurance and technology agreements. Teachers will explain to students all the expectations, how to log into the device, and how to use the school related software/apps.



**Painting:** Over the course of the next few years, Central will be phasing in a new painting scheme. We started in the Grade 2, Grades 3 and 4 hallways.

**Courtyards:** We are adding more landscaping and our Garden Club will design a Butterfly garden for us.

### **Student Safety**

**Transportation Changes:** The safety for our children is always paramount. Arrival and dismissal is the busiest time of day on the property. It is paramount that you help us by sending all transportation changes in note format or call Central's main office in the morning but no later than 2:30. We send out all dismissal changes to teachers by 2:45.

**Visitors:** Just a friendly reminder that we use School Gate Guardian as our visitor tracking and badging system. For entry into the school, visitors will have their driver's license scanned so please remember to bring your driver's license with you if entering the building.

**Drills:** Student safety always remains our top priority. Students participate in monthly fire drills, semi-annual ALICE/lockdown drills, evacuation, and severe weather drills each school year. ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) training will be explained and noted in the Scoop prior to practicing.

### **Positive Behavior Support (PBS)**

The elementary schools worked together to create a Positive Behavior Support Program which we named PAWS. This is a matrix of behavioral

## 2021 COVID-19 Mitigation Strategies

As per the Board approved Health and Safety Plan, below are some of the general adjustments that we will use to start school, but as you know the impact of COVID-19 is continually changing and we will adjust as directed by the Allegheny Health Department.

### **Updated Mitigation Efforts:**

\*Students will continue to be taught how to social distance, appropriate hand washing techniques, and how to sneeze/cough into the elbow. Reminder signage will be posted throughout the building.

\*At the District's Elementary Schools all students, staff and visitors are required to participate in mask-wearing when indoors except those students who have a documented medical condition, disability, or religious exemption. Masking is not required when outdoors.

\*Students and bus drivers will be required to wear facemasks on District transportation, regardless of vaccination status, as per the federal order issued in January of 2021.

\*Use of outdoor courtyards and playground spaces will be used for instruction as much as weather permits.

\*Families are asked to continue to monitor for COVID-19 symptoms prior to sending children to school.

#### Classrooms:

Student desks will be arranged 3 feet apart to the extent possible. Teachers will promote frequent handwashing and/or sanitizing. Teachers will continue best instructional practices that may include movement, partner work, and centers. Sanitizing supplies to support healthy hygiene practices are available in all classrooms. Bipolar air ionization units have been added to all classroom ventilation systems.

#### Breakfast/Lunch:

District purchased breakfast and lunch will be in the cafeteria. Students will sit with their assigned homeroom, 3 feet apart to the maximum extent feasible. All students will wash their hands prior to lunch.

The District is once again able to provide "universal free meals" for all students. Any extra meals or a la cart items will need to be purchases.

## Transportation

### **District Transportation:**

Students riding a bus or van will be expected to wear a face covering.

#### **AM Arrival**

Although the elementary school start time has been pushed back by 15 minutes, **school doors will continue to open at 8:00am.** Bus Rooms will be supervised daily beginning at 8:00 and until students are dismissed to homerooms at 8:45am.

**AM Drop-Off:** Use the North entrance and drop children at the side lobby doors.

PM Pick-Up: We will dismiss in two waves, A-O at 3:25 and P-Z at 3:30. Students will wait inside. Families are asked to park and wait outside. A staff member will dismiss students from the building and will keep record that students have been picked up. Please bring your ID. If you are picking up your student on a regular basis we will make a pick up sign for you. Please send in a note at the beginning of the year indicating that your student

will primarily be a car rider.
