Technology: 1-1 Devices

Students in Grades 1, 2 and 3 will each be assigned an iPad. Students in Grades 4 and 5 will each be assigned a HP ProBook. Students in Kindergarten will have access to iPads during school day, they are not personally assigned.

After the start of the school year, we will distribute student devices during the school day to new students and students in grades 1, 2, 3, and 4 who turned in their device at the conclusion of last school year. Just a reminder that students in Grades in 2 and 3 should still have their power cords at home. Students in Grade 5 should bring their device charged on the first day of school. In addition, families will need to complete and return a “Student Device User Agreement” form that will be sent home at the start of the year. You should have already received an email about securing insurance for the district issued devices.

WELCOME BACK

New Student Orientation, August 19 @ 9:00 am: For new to Central incoming students entering grades K-5. Students and families will have the opportunity to learn about Central, tour the school, and meet other new students.

Let's Get Acquainted (LGA): Please note the date of your child's grade level information night on page one. I encourage you to attend because the homeroom teachers will provide a brief overview of the curriculum and their expectations. We will also have some key support personnel available so that you can become familiar with the services in place to support student success in the classroom.

First Day of School, August 25: We spend the first several days of school assisting children to become acclimated to the location of their new classroom and other important spaces in the building. We review bus room procedures and what to do when arriving and leaving the building. Faculty and staff are stationed at doors and hallways to escort our students to their designated bus room until they become comfortable. Students sit by homerooms, then teachers escort their classes to their rooms. Bus/Van riders will enter in the front of the school and students who are car riders will enter on the left side of the building. The side lobby door will be open at 8:15 for car riders, adjusted from last year. It is helpful if students know their assigned homeroom teacher's

name. Don't worry if they forget, we have rosters to help us organize everyone.

Grade 1: Homeroom teachers of all grade one students will review and explain all lunch procedures before lunch on the first day of school. We will have several staff on hand during 1st grade lunch to ensure a smooth transition and make sure all students become comfortable with the procedures. Again, if they forget their number we will have our lists with us.

Kindergarten Orientation, August 25: Held on the first day of school. Parents and their child should plan to attend the timeframe your child is assigned to attend kindergarten.

PM Pick-Up: We will dismiss in two waves, A-O at 3:25 and P-Z at 3:30. Students will wait inside. Families are asked to park and wait outside. A staff member will dismiss students from the building and will keep record that students have been picked up. Please bring your ID. If you are picking up your student on a regular basis we will make a pick up sign for you. Please send in a note at the beginning of the year indicating that your student will primarily be a car rider.

Scoop (Weekly Packet): Central's online weekly communication with all updated information and calendar changes. It is published on Central's website every Thursday afternoon. Student Safety / ALICE

Transportation Changes: The safety for our children is always paramount. Arrival and dismissal is the busiest time of day on the property. It is paramount that you help us by sending all transportation changes in note format or call Central's main office in the morning but no later than 2:30. We send out all dismissal changes to teachers by 2:45.

Visitors: Just a friendly reminder that we use School Gate Guardian as our visitor tracking and badging system. For entry into the school, visitors will have their driver's license scanned so please remember to bring your driver's license with you if entering the building.

Drills: Student safety always remains our top priority. Students participate in monthly fire drills, semi-annual ALICE/lockdown drills, evacuation, and severe weather drills each school year. ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) training will be explained and noted in the Scoop prior to practicing.

Positive Behavior Support (PBS)

The three elementary schools worked together to create a Positive Behavior Support Program which we named PAWS. This is a matrix of behavioral expectations that will be taught and reinforced by faculty. More information can be found on the website Behavior Expectations and at Let's Get Acquainted.
